Fast Facts

In sub-Saharan Africa, 57% of adults with HIV are women and young women 15 to 24 are more than three times as likely to be infected as young men.

Globally, more than 80% of women do not have sufficient knowledge about HIV/AIDS and many women do not have the power to say no to sex with an infected partner.

Every year an estimated 4 million women and girls are bought and sold worldwide.

In Bosnia, more than 10,000 victims of trafficking are in the country at one time

More than 59 million school-aged girls are not in school and female illiteracy rates remain higher than men.

About 530,000 women die annually in pregnancy or during childbirth, mainly due to lack of access to health care.

History

Since 1962, the International Service Program has supported training, education, health, sanitation, agricultural, and micro-credit assistance to women in more than 20 countries, primarily through the agencies of the United Nations.
