Message from our club President

When I began my membership with Zonta (the women's service organization) I was looking for a way to connect with other adults and learn more about current events. What I am getting is a whole new outlook. I am so proud that we are making a difference in so many individual lives. I love that Dirk demonstrates daily, that giving back to the community is hugely more effective than newspaper ads; not only because it's good for business, but because it's the right thing to do.

Locally, our Zonta Club has produced a Human Trafficking Awareness Symposium, creating a task force and steering committee that will provide a comprehensive array of support and services to victims and law enforcement. We are producing our third Glass Slipper Ball, a major fundraising event that will continue to fund a life skills program for domestic violence victims being supported at the local safe house, as well as other women's support organizations along the Front Range. www.zontapikespeak.org

Jason and Jean-Luc enjoy helping with some of my Zonta projects and did a project of their own too. Jason produced and sent out flyers to the effect that if folks would give a donation to Jean-Luc's favorite charity, Jean-Luc would cut his hair! Besides donations to smaller fundraisers around the area, and a huge amount of support to Zonta's Glass Slipper Ball, Dirk's big annual service event is Wine and Roses. produced by the Tri-Lakes Women's Club to support Tri-Lakes Cares (community support in the Tri-Lakes Area which includes Monument— our store's location.) Dirk and his suppliers donate all of the wine and their time to a Grand Wine Tasting that offers guests around 100 different wines to try. In addition, Dirk donates a "Dinner with the Wine Seller" (or "The Wine Seller's Wife Cooks!") for their silent auction. That's some really fabulous wines and a multi-course dinner in our home for 3 couples. Project: Safe Cities for Women Project in Guatemala City, Guatemala and San Salvador, El Salvador

> THE GOAL: Safe Cities for Women will increase the safety of women in Guatemala City, Guatemala and San Salvador, El Salvador by helping local women collaborate with the local government and urban planners to create practical solutions, public policies, and municipal plans that decrease the risk of violence against women in their cities. The project will build on a larger, ongoing UNIFEM regional effort in four other Latin America urban areas.

Project: **Reduction of Obstetric Fistula in Liberia**

> **THE GOAL**: Contribute to the elimination of obstetric fistula and the reduction of maternal and newborn mortality and morbidity in Liberia.
