Human Trafficking Awareness Symposium



In planning our 3rd Annual Human Trafficking Awareness Symposium we have many things for which we are grateful. The main thing is the continued sponsorship from the Zonta Club of the Pikes Peak Area! This has allowed us to invite one of our main speakers, Teresa Flores, author of Slave Across the Street, survivor, and director of Gracehaven House, a shelter for human trafficking victims.

She is joined by Kevin Austin, from NOT FOR SALE, and Colorado Springs' own Resident in Charge, Michael Flanagan, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. Kevin will bring us his experiences using Art while focusing on the reality of human trafficking and the hope for change. Michael will share the federal government's efforts to combat the criminal element and a few case reports.

We are adding an HT 101 session at 8:00-8:30 am for those who are new to the subject. We had remarks last year from attendees that they didn't understand a lot of the speakers' comments for a while as the terms were unfamiliar. This way, those who choose to, may get a quick overview before registration, 8:30, and before the session starts, 9:00.

After a free lunch, we will have a panel with four local organizations who are involved with human trafficking and human right abuse activities:

- -Human Trafficking Task Force of Southern Colorado - Service Provider Network, Child Trafficking
- -Yobel Market Uganda trip, youth work in Woodland Park, and Fair Trade
- -Urban Peak Youth Outreach
- -Lutheran Family Services- Refugees, Asylees serviced in Colorado Springs

We will finish the afternoon with breakout sessions (Time for Action), and a 15 minute Closing at 4pm.


