

BUILD A BETTER WORLD FOR WOMEN AND GIRLS

Zonta of the Pikes Peak Area Foundation is pleased to announce our fund recipients for 2024!

Local Programs:

<u>Fostering Hope</u> is an enduring community of affirmation and support for local children and teens and their foster families. Our award, created to honor the life's work of our beloved #ZontaZister Shannon Rowan, goes towards helping young women moving from foster care into independent adulthood.

The Haseya Advocate Program is a Native woman-led organization that serves Indigenous survivors of domestic and sexual violence in the state of Colorado. Haseya empowers native survivors to overcome domestic and sexual violence by providing culturally sensitive and appropriate advocacy, including safety planning, access to resources, accompaniment, and problem solving.

The Human Trafficking Task Force of Southern Colorado works to prevent labor and sex trafficking through awareness and advocacy, and through intervening in the human trafficking cycle through collaboration with individuals, agencies and organizations. It also connects those impacted by modern-day slavery to restorative resources. The Task Force was founded by our beloved #ZontaZister, Betty Edwards, who passed away this spring. We support their

work through our Zonta Says NO campaign.

Our YWPA (Young Women in Public Affairs) award recipient is Meghan Taylor. The Young Women in Public Affairs Award recognizes women ages 16-19 for their active commitment to volunteerism, experience in local government, student government, or workplace leadership (paid or unpaid), and volunteer leadership achievements. The Karen Possehl Women's Endowment (KPWE) is a scholarship program at UCCS for non-traditional female students (age 25 and older) who have faced challenges completing their college education. These women are provided annual financial awards along with assistance with childcare and a volunteer community mentor, and professional development and career coaching. KPWE achieves a graduation rate of over 85% and has changed the lives of countless women in our community.

<u>The Leadership Pikes Peak-Signature Program</u> for women empowers participants to thrive through strength-based leadership, tapping into their true potential to make a significant impact in the community.

Women Partnering strives to improve the overall health and wellbeing of women and their children in the Colorado Springs community. The partnering approach focuses on empowerment and addressing the needs of the whole woman by creating concrete goals around economic sustainability, access to education, employment, access to health and behavioral health care and community connections.

Programs Overseas:

The mission of <u>Trampled Rose</u>, founded by Colorado Springs' own Becky Kiser, is to keep Ethiopian girls from rural communities and small villages in school through college, providing each girl dignity, freedom, and love along the way.

The <u>Zonta International Rose Fund</u> supports our International Service Projects, which continue to help women in developing countries improve their legal,

political, economic, educational and nealth status. Current projects can be found in Peru, Madagasgar, Papua New Guinea and Timor-Leste, and past projects span the globe! We invite you to read more at the <u>zonta.org</u> website.

Remembering Betty Edwards - a life well lived!

On behalf of Zonta Pikes Peak Area we want to express our sincere condolences

to the family and friends of our dear Betty Edwards.

At Betty's memorial service, members of our club and guests from all over Zonta District 12 participated in a Yellow Rose Ceremony in Betty's honor.

The yellow rose is Zonta's flower symbolizing friendship. Zonta is an international service organization that works to build a better world for women and girls.

Betty was inducted into Zonta PPA in February 1988. She served in all board positions, including as the Club President from 1990 – 92 and then as District 12 Governor from 2000 – 2002. Betty also founded the Human Trafficking Task Force of Southern Colorado and served as its chair for many years. Betty was so influential in our club that we voted to make her an honorary member for the last few years as a way to express our gratitude to her service over the years.

Zonta PPA President Lisa Rice led us in sharing many memories at the ceremony, as well as distributing yellow roses, and members of Betty's family invited all to choose a scarf from Betty's personal collection to remember her by. We also invited all present to view the book we had created in Betty's honor, filled with photos and memories, a copy of which is preserved at the Pikes Peak Library District, downtown.

Betty will be greatly missed, and her life's work and influence in our personal lives will continue to inspire us in the years ahead.

Everyone in the Springs and nearby areas is invited to help us with our ongoing service project, in collaboration with the Woman's Club of Colorado Springs!

Goals: To recycle thin plastics (see attachment for examples)

To increase awareness about thin plastics, and the harm they cause to

our environment, and to reduce our dependency on them

How to help:

You'll need to weigh your plastics and email your totals each time you turn them in. You can weigh them at home or in the produce section at the store before turning them in. Email us at this <u>LINK</u>.

When you take your bag of thin plastics into King Soopers, you can put it next to the box that most locations have for recycling plastic bags. If you don't see that recycle box, please take your bag to Customer Service. It's not necessary to write WCCS on it. The way we get credit is for you to email us the following information:

Your name

The date

The weight of your plastic(s)

The location (which King Soopers - street name is fine)

See examples of thin plastics in the image below. When we reach our goal, a third bench will be added to a location chosen by the Woman's Club of Colorado Springs!

Note: This is a year-round plastics drive - Please keep us in mind in the months ahead!






